BOARD OPENINGS FOR US CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS 1 and 6

The Board currently has two Member positions open for appointment immediately. The positions are for US Congressional Districts 1 and 6. The positions open are for Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker, Licensed Master Social Worker who are current and in good standing. If you are a licensed social worker at this level of licensure from any District and are interested in serving on the Board, you may start collecting letters of nomination from fellow social workers from your District. The nomination letters and a resume must be mailed to the Board at 100 North Union Street, Suite 736, Montgomery, Alabama 36104, postmarked by September 30, 2024. The Governor makes the final selection from the list of the persons with the most nominations for the District.

If this is not something you're interested in, you may wish to submit a letter on behalf of someone. We'll accept nomination letters through September 30, 2024. We then submit the top three names for the District who receive the most letters to the Governor.

The Board appointment will be for **three years** running through September 30, 2027. There is no pay for serving under this capacity, but you are reimbursed for in state and out-of-state travel expenses at the same rate as a state employee.

The duties of the Board are:

- To protect the public from incompetent, unethical and unlawful social work practice.
- To enforce qualification standards for all levels of licensure and certification.
- To delineate unlawful conduct through disciplinary procedures against practitioners who violate applicable laws or rules.

Nomination Requirements:

- The person being nominated and the person doing the nominating **must** both live in the same District.
- You can nominate yourself.
- The person making the nomination must be a licensed social worker.
- Nomination letters must be mailed or you may collect the letters and send them in all together faxed or emailed letters **are not** acceptable.
